Part-Time Music Teacher

Trinity Episcopal Day School seeks a part-time Music Teacher for the 2026–2027 academic year (August start date) who embraces the whole-child educational philosophy and fosters a love of music through vocal and instrumental instruction. Trinity teachers benefit from small class sizes that support creativity, collaboration, and meaningful student engagement in a nurturing Christian environment. This is a ten-month, part-time position with annual renewal.

General Duties

- Plan and implement a developmentally appropriate music curriculum for Pre-K 3 through 5th grade, including vocal and instrumental music.
- Provide instruction in vocal music, including singing techniques, pitch, rhythm, and performance skills.
- Introduce and teach instrumental music, which may include classroom instruments (e.g., Orff instruments, recorders, percussion) and foundational music concepts.
- Foster a classroom environment that encourages creativity, self-expression, and appreciation for diverse musical styles and cultures.
- Teach fundamental music literacy skills, including rhythm notation, melody, tempo, and dynamics.
- Prepare students for performances such as school programs, chapel music, or special events.
- Collaborate with faculty and administration to integrate music into school-wide events and the spiritual life of the school, including chapel services when appropriate.
- Maintain and organize music materials, instruments, and classroom space.
- Model positive behavior, collaboration, and respect for others in all interactions.
- Differentiate instruction to meet the developmental needs and abilities of all students.
- Communicate effectively with parents, colleagues, and administration regarding student progress and performances.
- Participate in faculty meetings, professional development, and school events
- Perform other duties as assigned, including supervision and support of school activities.



Qualifications and Skills

- Bachelor's degree in Music Education, Education Music, or related field required.
- Experience teaching music to elementary-aged children preferred.
- Demonstrated proficiency in vocal instruction and at least one instrumental area.
- Knowledge of child development and age-appropriate music pedagogy (e.g., Orff, Kodály, or similar approaches preferred).
- Ability to engage students through interactive, hands-on, and performance-based learning.
- Strong classroom management and organizational skills.
- Excellent communication skills with students, parents, and colleagues.
- Warm, energetic, and creative approach to teaching.
- Commitment to diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging.
- Strong sense of professionalism and collaboration.
- Familiarity with Episcopal education or willingness to support the school's spiritual and community life.
- CPR/First Aid certification (or willingness to obtain).
- Completion of required background check and Safeguarding God's People training.
