Part-Time Religion Teacher

Trinity Episcopal Day School seeks a part-time Religion Teacher for the 2026–2027 academic year (August start date) who embraces the whole-child educational philosophy and the spiritual formation of children within the Episcopal tradition. Trinity teachers benefit from small class sizes that allow for meaningful engagement, reflective practice, and a nurturing Christian environment. This is a ten-month, part-time position with annual renewal.

General Duties

- Plan and implement developmentally appropriate religion curriculum for students in Pre-K 3 through 5th grade.
- Use the Godly Play curriculum to guide spiritual formation and storytelling-based religious education for early childhood students.
- Utilize the Revised Common Lectionary to develop lessons and thematic units for elementary students, connecting scripture to students' daily lives.
- Foster a classroom environment that encourages wonder, reflection, respect, and spiritual curiosity.
- Teach core Christian values grounded in the Episcopal tradition, including compassion, inclusion, service, and respect for the dignity of every human being.
- Collaborate with classroom teachers to integrate faith-based themes across subject areas when appropriate.
- Co-plan and lead weekly school chapel services, including planning age-appropriate messages, prayers, and student participation.
- Co-plan and lead two-day school Sunday church services a year.
- Co-plan the Christmas pageant
- Share prayer request with faculty and staff as needed (for illness, loss of a loved one, etc)
- Create a safe, inclusive, and welcoming environment for students of all backgrounds.
- Communicate effectively with parents, colleagues, and administration regarding student growth and curriculum.
- Participate in faculty meetings, professional development, and school events as appropriate for a part-time role.
- Perform other duties as assigned, including supervisory responsibilities.



Qualifications and Skills

- Bachelor's degree required; degree in Theology, Religious Studies, Education, or related field preferred.
- Experience working with children in a school, church, or ministry setting preferred.
- Familiarity with or willingness to be trained in Godly Play methodology.
- Understanding of or willingness to teach from the Revised Common Lectionary.
- Knowledge of and appreciation for the Episcopal tradition and its approach to inclusive, inquiry-based faith formation.
- Strong classroom management and organizational skills.
- Ability to engage students through storytelling, discussion, and reflective practices.
- Excellent communication skills with students, parents, and colleagues.
- Warm, nurturing, and patient demeanor with a genuine love for children.
- Commitment to diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging.
- CPR/First Aid certification (or willingness to obtain).
- Completion of diocesan background check and Safeguarding God's People training.
